

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This continuing medical education program is the annual educational conference of the NC Thoracic Society. On Saturday November 16, while enjoying the view of the Speedway, participate a high-quality educational conference that pro vides cutting edge information on sedation and mechanical ventilation in the ICU, updates on low-dose CT scanning for lung cancer, and current reviews on sarcoidosis and pulmonary hypertension. In addition, case and research presentations by pulmonary fellows from each of the training programs will be provided. Our program will begin with a keynote speaker from Vanderbilt University, Wes Ely, MD on critical care medicine. If interested, we have a business meeting, reception, and dinner late afternoon/evening November 15, 2019.

OBJECTIVES

The overall goals of this program are to enhance learner's knowledge and their ability to incorporate evidence-based medicine and best practices into their work settings and communities. At the conclusion of this activity, the participant should be able to:

- 1) Understand adverse outcomes associated with improper sedation in the ICU setting
- 2) Discuss effects of excessive and prolonged use of mechanical ventilation in the ICU
- 3) Understand latest evidence on lung protective ventilation strategies
- 4) Review the evidence and risk/benefits of lung cancer screening
- Discuss updates in sarcoidosis with respect to its epidemiology, clinical presentation, diagnosis and treatment
- 6) Outline a research project that will explore the immune responses underlying the relationship between lung injury, muscle wasting and the response to exercise interventions in preclinical models
- 7) Identify the role of GAK inhibition on function of alveolar epithelial stem cells
- 8) Understand the current clinical classification of pulmonary hypertension as well as current treatment guidelines and new clinical trial data.
